1. Dramatic Play Equipment (Kindergarten) Monteith (\$3,731)

This grant purchases wooden play equipment replacements for 3 Kindergarten classes. Dramatic play is a mandatory part of early childhood learning goals, as the students learn about collaboration, compassion and diversity, while using the new kitchen equipment. GPFPE is fortunate to be able to fund this grant through the Lois J. Warden Fund that has been established for important elementary programs within the school system. 2. All Hands on Deck (Grade 3) Mason (\$406)

Math manipulatives will be purchased for this classroom to make mathematic instruction more interactive and engaging, in a workshop environment. This instructor will use the purchased games to build math proficiency and fluency, while also encouraging different learning styles. This grant will also be funded by the *Lois J. Warden Fund. 3. Integrating Literacy into the Maire Makerspace (Grades K-4) Maire (\$750)

5. iPads to Interact with New Smart Board Software (Grades 5-8) Parcells, Brownell and Pierce (\$6,808)

The Math departments at the three middle schools requested iPads and accessories for teachers to connect with new SMART Board technology. This will allow better social distancing within the classroom during in-person instruction, as well as accommodate virtual sharing of the SMART Board, through a Screen Mirroring feature. 6. Hands on Art (Grades 5-8) Parcells (\$402)

This grant will purchase wire and equipment to allow instruction in 3D manipulation in Art Class, offering another medium in which to create. The classroom teacher wants her students to see that art is not just drawing and painting and hopes that this hands-on opportunity will allow her students to learn more about spatial skills. 7. Chromebooks for Everyday Lessons and Growth (Post High School Students)Community School (\$3,179)

This is a partial grant to fund the purchase of ten Chromebooks and a cart for use in the GPPSS Community School. Developmentally disabled students will use the technology to engage in exploring and researching potential jobs and careers, practice data entry and learn e-commerce as a microbusiness. 8. Bring Out the Bass (Grades 5-12) Brownell, Parcells and North (\$8,000) Another partial grant will fund the purchase of two Sousaphones for two middle schools and North High. 9. New Vibraphone (Grades 9-12) South (\$3,993)

10. Impairment Goggles (Grades 9-12)North (\$600)

GPFPE is pleased to fund this innovative grant, submitted by a North counselor, which buys six impairment goggles, which he intends to use to help students learn valuable life experiences. The students will experience, virtually, the effect of drugs and alcohol on their systems, while being instructed in possible legal ramifications from their use. 11. Early Childhood Hands-On (E.C.H.O.) Library and Resource Center (Preschool) Trombly Early Childhood Center (\$2,000)

Library and Resource Center will become the district's first early childhood resource center and will provide a safe and nurturing environment for young minds

12. Engaging Preschoolers in Movement (Preschool) Barnes (\$2,319)

16. Harmony Directors to Help Retrain Ensemble Skills (5th-12th grade) Brownell, Pierce, Parcells, South and North (\$4,775)

17. iPad Cart and Twenty iPads (9th-10th grade) South (\$8,359)
