GPFPE Grants Awarded to GPPSS

1. Books for Library, Classrooms and Students (Ages 3-5) Barnes (\$2,000)

This ASD instructor wishes to establish a lending library within the Early Childhood Program at Barnes. This partial grant award will provide age appropriate board books for students and classrooms to promote literacy engagement and social interaction. Funds awarded are provided through the *Lois J. 1. First Tee School Program (Young 5s - 4th grade) All Elementary Schools (\$3,250)
